CHILD SEXUAL EXPLOITATION IS A SERIOUS CRIME.

WARNING SIGNS AND BEH AVIOURS

- · Missing from home or care
- Physical injuries
- · Involvement in offending
- Repeat sexually-transmitted infections, pregnancy and terminations
- Absent from school
- Change in physical appearance
- Evidence of sexual bullying
- Vulnerability via the internet and/or social networking
- · Estranged from their family
- · Receipt of gifts from unknown sources

CSE VULNERABILITIES INCLUDE

- Chaotic/dysfunctional household
- Parental substance use, mental health issues and criminality
- Domestic abuse and/or neglect
- History of abuse familial sexual abuse, risk of forced marriage, risk of 'honour'based abuse, physical and emotional abuse
- Recent bereavement or loss
- CSE Gang association
- Friends/association with sexually exploited young people e.g. school
- Learning disabilities
- Unsure about their sexual orientation/family unaware
- Homelessness
- Lacking friends from the same age group

WHAT TO DO NEXT

If, as a worker I see any of the CSE signs or behaviours in a young person or if I hear anything that might alert others to where children may be exposed or be placed in a vulnerable situation what should I do?

If you have information, however small, that could be part of the jigsaw of information being gathered to help stop Child Sexual Exploitation contact your Designated Officer: Safeguarding Children.
